Charlotte B. Royeen, OTR/L, FAOTA, FASAHP, FNAP, PhD, is the Dean of the College of Health Sciences, Rush University in Chicago, Illinois, USA. She received her Master of Science in Occupational Therapy at Washington University School of Medicine and her Doctor of Philosophy from Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. Dr. Royeen has received many honors and awards recognizing her for her work in the field of occupational therapy, including the Eleanor Clarke Slagle Lectureship Award – the highest scholarly award bestowed by the American Occupational Therapy Association. Most recently, she was named the A. Watson Armour III and Sarah Armour Presidential Professor at Rush University. This honor recognizes special excellence as an academic leader in the biomedical sciences. Dr. Royeen has published more than 40 books and book chapters and 75 journal articles, and she brings a wealth of leadership experience to the college and to the entire Rush University community.

Dr. Tanioka earned his Ph.D. from Kochi University of Technology, Japan (2002) and PhD in Nursing Science from St. Paul University Philippines (2021). He also obtained his Master of Science in Nursing from St. Paul University Philippines in 2018, M.A. from Shikoku Gakuin University (1999), and BEd. from Meisei University Japan (1997). Following graduation from Kochi Prefectural Nursing School and licensure as Registered Nurse (1988), he worked for 11 years in a Psychiatric Hospital in Japan. He found his passion for nursing research focused on studying human technologies, integrating science and technology within the perspective of nursing caring science. He continues to contribute immensely towards the clarification of technological competency as caring in nursing and create high quality care processes within varying technological environments. His continuing engagement in nursing towards enhancing interdisciplinary and collaborative endeavors for nursing is focused on caring, exemplified as the integration of science and technology through research on human technologies, practice and education. He is a member of the Editorial Boards of the Open Journal Health, the International Journal of Nursing & Clinical Nursing Practice, the Journal of Art and Aesthetics in Nursing and Health Sciences, the International Journal for Human Caring, and the Journal of Health and Caring Sciences. He is a recognized Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing (FAAN). Dr. Tanioka was visiting scholar at the Christine E. Lynn College of Nursing, Florida Atlantic University. He is known for his

Transactive Relationship Theory of Nursing (TRETON): A Nursing Engagement Model for Persons and Humanoid Nursing Robots, and the electronic health administration system entitled, Psychiatric Outcome Management System (PSYCHOMS®). His most recent book "Nursing Robots" for the elderly was released in March 2017.

Honorable Sayed Jalal Karim is the Former Ambassador and Special Envoy for the President of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan to Saudi Arabia from 2016 to 2020 and concurrently served as non-Resident Ambassador of Afghanistan to the Kingdom of Bahrain (2017-2020). He also served as mediator of successful peace talks between the Afghan Government and other institutions/governments and Taliban.

Hon. Karim founded the Abdullah bin Zubair School in Mecca in 2000 for the education of orphans of the Afghan community residing in Saudi Arabia. He is also the founder and owner of Radio Afghanistan and the Voice of Afghanistan which was aired from London in 2001. Currently, he is a Board Member and CEO of Jubail Pharma Company Ltd and a Board Member of Marasel Group both in Al-Khobar, KSA.

At 8 years old, he received the Higher Secondary School Certificate. When he was 9 years old, Hon. Karim received a scholarship from Columbia University, USA for his university degree. He was also awarded scholarship by the Afghan government at Moscow University. He earned a master's degree in political science from Seton Hall University, USA.

Leodoro J. Labrague, RN, DM, PhD, CNE, is a Clinical Assistant Professor at the renowned Marcella Niehoff School of Nursing, Loyola University Chicago. Holding two doctorate degrees, a Doctor of Philosophy in Management and a Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing Science, he exemplifies a multidisciplinary approach to research and scholarship.

With over 15 years of experience, Dr. Labrague has made significant contributions to the fields of nursing education and research. He began his teaching career in the Philippines, where he dedicated seven years to refining his skills and expertise in nursing education. Seeking to broaden his horizons, he spent another seven years teaching in the Sultanate of Oman, gaining invaluable cross-cultural experiences and collaborating with researchers from various countries.

Dr. Labrague's research contributions are highly regarded, particularly his development of two important research scales: the Toxic Leadership Behavior Scale for Nurse Managers and the Lockdown Fatigue Scale. These scales have gained widespread recognition and utilization among nursing professionals and researchers. Additionally, he has actively collaborated with researchers from Saudi Arabia, India, Oman, Greece, Nigeria, Australia, the Philippines, and the United States, expanding the impact of his research globally.

As a prolific writer, Dr. Labrague has authored and co-authored over 100 articles in high-impact nursing journals, accumulating an impressive citation count of over 8000. This distinction solidifies his position as one of the highly cited Filipino nurse researchers. Moreover, his research has garnered international recognition, earning him a prestigious spot among the Top 2% Scientists in the World based on Sandford's list for two consecutive years (2021/2022). Dr. Labrague's commitment to advancing nursing research and practice extends beyond his own publications. As an Associate Editor of Nursing Open at Wiley Publishing, he actively shapes the future of nursing by contributing to the publication and dissemination of cutting-edge research.

EFFECT OF SELF-MANAGEMENT INTERVENTION ON NURSES' DISCIPLINE DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC AT A PRIVATE HOSPITAL IN YOGYAKARTA, INDONESIA

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Abstract. Nurse discipline is one of the crucial behavioral factors in the nursing profession. During the Covid-19 pandemic, nurses were required to be even more disciplined in terms of using universal precaution and other nursing service procedures to prevent transmission of the virus. Nurses need interventions to help themselves carry out their disciplinary duties. Self-management is one of the interventions that provide experience for individuals to regulate their own behavior especially in terms of discipline. This study aimed to determine the effect of self-management on the level of nurses' discipline using pre-experimental method involving 50 nurses. Observation sheets were used to evaluate nurses' discipline in pre- and post-self-management on the level of nurses' discipline during the Covid-19 pandemic at a private hospital in Yogyakarta, Indonesia. Private hospital nurses need to acquire self-management training periodically to improve their discipline level in nursing care services.
